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Stroke is the third leading cause of mortality in Tennessee, yet stroke patients' care differs across the state. In Tennessee, rates of compliance with nationally accepted guidelines for treatment and primary/secondary prevention of stroke from the American Stroke Association, the Brain Attack Coalition and the Joint Commission vary significantly between Primary Stroke Centers (PSCs) and non-PSCs.

The Tennessee Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention Plan outlines objectives to prevent stroke, improve access to care and emergent treatment, and ensure that all Tennesseans diagnosed with stroke receive aggressive treatment to prevent mortality, associated complications or disabilities. Education to improve the healthcare provider's knowledge of these guidelines is critical to improving outcomes for these patients.
