**Updated UTHSC Faculty Handbook**

The **UTHSC Faculty Handbook** has been revised, effective August 2018. Download a copy of this new version today for the latest information that has been changed including (1) replacement of Cumulative Performance Review (CPR) with Enhanced Post-Tenure Performance Review (EPPR), (2) required edits for campus tenure review procedures to comply with the Board of Trustees policy, (3) insertion of anonymous voting throughout, and (4) revision of language for Visiting Professors and Distinguished Visiting Professors.

To clearly delineate the August 2018 revision from the prior December 2015 version, the document now has (1) an updated last revision date of August 2018 in the footer, (2) Calibri 11 font, versus Times New Roman 12, and (3) a new cover page. The document also now contains an Appendix M (procedure for EPPR).

It is important to note that additional areas in the Faculty Handbook are being worked on to align them with the requirements of the most recent Board of Trustees Policies on Academic Freedom, Responsibility and Tenure. As noted in Section 1.4 of the UTHSC Faculty Handbook - when

- **NetID and password** - all students, faculty, and staff at the University of Tennessee have a NetID and password. Your NetID permits secure access to several web-based applications, including the Library, Blackboard, and others. Your appointing department can notify you once you have a NetID.
  - How do you know you have a NetID? Once you are added to our [online directory](#), your NetID (an 8-character unique identifier) is official and can be used.

2018-2019 Faculty Evaluation Calendar

### 2018-2019 SCHEDULE FOR PROMOTION AND TENURE PROCESS

1. **September/October 2018:** UTHSC Chief Academic Officer (the Vice Chancellor for Academic, Faculty & Student Affairs) prepares and emails promotion and tenure instructions to Deans, Department Chairs and Directors.
2. **October 2018:** Departments initiate a defined process for reviewing each faculty member to be considered for promotion\* and/or tenure. The process is established by each department in accord with the provisions of the [Faculty Handbook](#) and University policies; each faculty member should be advised, in writing, that he or she is being evaluated and should be given an opportunity to submit information pertaining to the review of performance and future promise.
3. **November 2018 - January 2019:** Departmental chairs and directors prepare recommendations for promotion and awarding of tenure and forward them to the Dean. The due date for receipt of these recommendations will be made at the discretion of each college dean.
4. **No later than the end of February 2019:** Deans should forward to the UTHSC Chief Academic Officer any negative or controversial recommendations (**forward earlier if possible**), as extra time may be required for reviews at higher levels or for appeal by the faculty member.
5. **No later than March 11, 2019:** Departments should review budgets and their needs for non-tenure track faculty and submit a list of faculty members who may be subject to nonrenewal to the UTHSC Chief Academic Officer, 400 Hyman.
6. **No later than March 11, 2019:** Deans reviews the positive or noncontroversial recommendations for promotion and tenure and forward their final recommendations to the UTHSC Chief Academic Officer, 400 Hyman Building.
7. **By April 1, 2019:** The UTHSC Chief Academic Officer reviews recommendations and prepares a consolidated report for the Chancellor.
8. **Before May 2019:** The consolidated recommendations for promotion and tenure approved by the Chancellor are forwarded to Knoxville.
9. **June 2019:** The President acts only on the Chancellor's positive recommendation for tenure. If the President concurs in the positive recommendation, he or she shall grant tenure if he or she is authorized to do so, and the Chancellor shall give the faculty member written notice of the effective date of tenure. If only the Board is authorized to grant tenure, the President shall submit the recommendation to grant tenure, and summary

Welcome to the UTHSC Health Sciences Library's Research & Learning Connection (RLC) where you will find resources and tools combined with services to help advance your research. Feature services include:

- Systematic Reviews** - partner with a [liaison librarian](#) with expertise and training on systematic reviews.
- Research Impact** - ask a [liaison librarian](#) to quantify your research impact for promotion, tenure, or grant applications;
- Expert Literature Search** - contact the library for an expert search of the library databases on any topic.
- Endnote Guide** - streamline the organization of your references and write your paper in the desired style;
- Information Consultation** - meet one-on-one with a [liaison librarian](#) about a research project and advise how to use specific resources, such as PubMed, Scopus, Web of Science, or ClinicalKey.

A JAMA article, published on [September 10, 2014](#), asked authors to systematically review the literature and recommended authors collaborating with medical librarians when writing review articles. The reason was "extensive literature searches can be difficult to perform, given the complexity of the search process and author's time constraints. It's also unlikely that a content expert will be familiar with the intricacies of more than one database."

Research Impact

Research impact can be measured in different ways using different tools. Traditionally, the indicators included the number of times a publication was cited and journal impact. Recent years, altmetrics have been used to measure a researcher's impact, which takes into account not just academic citations (traditional means), but also digital use and sharing of data (non-traditional means). It can include the number of times a paper has been viewed, tweeted, 'liked' on Facebook, covered by the media or blogs, downloaded, cited on Wikipedia or bookmarked online.

**Author/Article Impact**

- Altmetrics for Scopus** is a 3rd party web application that runs within the sidebar of Scopus article and abstract pages. It displays all of the social or mainstream media mentions gathered for a particular paper as well as reader counts on popular reference managers (e.g., CiteULike and Mendeley)
- H index** is based on a scholar's most cited works and the number of times these have been referenced in the literature. Tools for calculating your H-index include [Scopus](#), [Web of Science](#), and [Google Scholar Citations](#).
- H10 index** is created and is only used by Google Scholar.
- PLoS Article Level Metrics (ALM)** is a service provided by the Public Library of Science (PLoS) for all authors of works published in PLoS journals.
- Research ID:** A free product developed by Thomson Reuters. Once registered, a researcher is assigned a unique ID number that associated with their publications. If you have an [EndNote Online account](#) or [Web of Science](#) account you do not need to register with Research ID site.
- Publish or Perish** - From Harzing.com, a well-known resource in scholarly publishing, this software tool calculates numerous research metrics based on Google Scholar data.

**Journal Impact**

- Journal Citation Report (JCR)** is an authoritative resource for impact factor data from ISI Web of Knowledge. JCR provides impact factors and rankings of journals in the social and life sciences based on millions of citations. It serves as a means to compare different journals in a field of study.
- Journal Metrics** is from Elsevier and uses [Scopus](#) as data source. It applies to over 20,000 journals, book series, and proceedings. [Journal Metrics](#) uses the following three different impact metrics to evaluate a journal's research impact:
  - SNIP (Source Normalized Impact per Paper)** measures contextual citation impact by weighting citations based on the total number of citations in a subject field.
  - IPP (The Impact per Publication)** measures the ratio of citations per article published in the journal.
  - SJR (SCImago Journal Rank)** is a prestige metric based on the idea that not all citations are the same.
- Eigenfactor Score and Article Influence** are ratings of the total importance of a scientific journal or article.
- Google Scholar Metrics** provides an easy way to quickly gauge the visibility and influence of recent articles in scholarly publications. Scholar Metrics summarize recent citations to many publications to help authors as they consider where to publish their new research. You can browse the [top 10 publications](#).

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## Jeffrey Beall

Librarian, CU Denver

Known for a defunct blog listing “potential, possible, or probable predatory scholarly open-access publishers,” known as *Beall’s List*



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### Bealls’ Claims about Predators

- Charge APCs
- Undergo little or no peer-review
- Solicit publications
- Poor quality

### Criticisms of Beall

- Definition “fuzzy”
- Blacklist cited little evidence
- Slow to edit/update
- Unclear motivations
- *One person’s view*

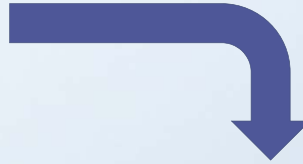

To obtain information on big deal prices, we wrote to 55 university libraries and 12 library consortia, invoking state Freedom of Information acts and requesting copies of recent site-license contracts signed with each of the nine publishers listed in Table 1.

Among the commercial publishers in our study, Elsevier's prices per citation are nearly 3 times those charged by the nonprofits, whereas Emerald, Sage, and Taylor & Francis have prices per citation that are roughly 10 times those of the nonprofits.

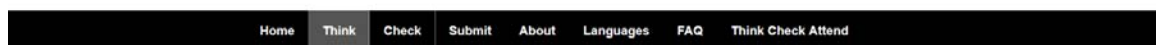
