

Its probably not significant if no one is talking about it. Unless you are an Einstein.



The American Heart Association (AHA) is now accepting applications for the <u>Transformational Project Award</u>. The program supports highly innovative, high-impact projects that build on work in progress that could ultimately lead to critical discoveries or major advancements that will accelerate the field of cardiovascular and stroke research.

- Research deemed innovative may be built around an emerging paradigm, approaching an existing problem from a new perspective, or exhibit other uniquely creative qualities.
- The Transformational Project Award (TPA) represents the second phase of a successful exploratory study that is already showing
 a high probability of revealing new avenues of investigation; proposals should include preliminary data.
- This program aims to provide pilot or seed funding that should lead to successful competition for additional funding beyond the
 pilot period.
- The principal investigator is responsible for clearly and explicitly articulating the project's innovation and the potential impact on cardiovascular and stroke research.

AHA awards are open to the array of academic and health professionals. This includes but is not limited to all academic disciplines (biology, chemistry, mathematics, technology, physics, engineering, etc.) and all health-related professions (physicians, nurses, nurse

CREATING YOUR ACCOUNT

If you don't have a Pivot account, go to http://pivot.cos.com and click on the Sign up link in the upper right of the screen. Fill out your Name, Email, Password, and Affiliated Institution. Civot email you register with must be the email at your affiliated institution. Pivot will not allow you to create an account if you enter a non-institutional email address.) Click the "Create my account" button and Pivot will send you an email to the address you supplied; in the email will be a verification URL Click on the URL and you can begin using Pivot right away!

LOGGING IN

There are two ways to access Pivot:

- 1) Use an on-campus computer and go directly to http://pivot.cos.com.
- 2)Log into Pivot at http://pivot.cos.com with your username and password. (If you have an old COS.com username and password, it will work with Pivot.) SEARCHING PIVOT FUNDING

There are several ways to search the Funding area of Pivot: Quick Search, Advanced Search and Sponsor search.

QUICK SEARCH

Use the Quick Search feature to search all fields of the funding opportunities in the database. To produce maximum results, all search terms entered are connected by the Boolean connector OR. The results of a Quick Search are always ranked by relevancy.

- Enter your search terms into the text box.
- 2. Click the "Search Pivot" button.




ADVANCED SEARCH

- Start by selecting the Match All or Match Any radio button at the top of the screen. This selection will add "And" or "Or" to the search rows beneath the option.
- Click on the drop-down menu to select which field to search (All Fields, Abstract, Title, Sponsor, or Sponsor ID).
- Enter your search terms into the boxes.
 If additional rows are needed, click
 Add another row.
- Additional fields are available click on any field name to expand the field options.
- Click Search.

Helpful Hint: You can determine which opportunities to exclude by entering terms in the Exclude These section.

Also note that your campus administrator may have pre-set Activity Location and/or Citizenship filters that are automatically included in your Funding Search. If those filters are set, you will see them at the top of the search screen. You can remove them by deselecting the check boxes to the left.

Office of Scientific Writing

The Office of Scientific Writing (OSW) is designed to assist research faculty, postdoctoral fellows, and students in the writing of successful research grants and scientific manuscripts. The office supports the research faculty at our Memphis, Nashville, Chattanooga, and Knoxville campuses. The investigator must first complete a **request form** and provide a complete first draft to initiate the process.

The Scientific Writers work with investigators to sharpen the language so that the proposal or manuscript presents all of the science and specific aims of one's research in a compelling manner, while being easy to read by reviewers. If a simple copy editing effort is all that's required, the proposal or manuscript will be checked for typos, missing words, grammar, etc. – but the scientific content and structure of the manuscript will not be subject to revision unless this effort is specifically requested. See our **FAQs webpage** for more details about OSW services.

Currently, there are two Scientific Writers who can assist you: Richard Redfearn, PhD, Director of the Office of Scientific Writing, and Patti Smith, MPH, Scientific Writer, Center for Health System Improvement. Dr. Redfearn's education and experience as a bioorganic and materials science investigator is suited to T0-T1 projects, closer to fundamental research. Ms. Smith has extensive writing experience, and her background in population health is most appropriate for the clinical, patient-centered side of the biomedical research spectrum, or T3-T4 research.


In terms of grant proposals, the work of the Office of Scientific Writing is to provide assistance on the Abstract, Specific Aims, Research Strategy, or any text-intensive section of your proposal. If you need help with grant budgeting or a budget justification, please contact the **Office of Sponsored Programs**.

Due to the high demand for services, we require one-week lead time for scientific writing assistance for proposals, prior to the internal submission deadline set by the Office of Sponsored Programs. In emergency time-critical grant application cases, we will work with you to deliver the markup of your proposal in an expedited fashion, depending upon the work already in progress at the time of submission.


