Research:

The fellows have been busy this year with publications and poster presentations! Dr. Holbert was able to present her research at the American Society of Echocardiography 2018 (Nashville) this year. She had a heart failure review published in conjunction with Dr. Mehmood, our new advanced heart failure specialist. Dr. Wehber presented a poster at Heart Failure Society of America 2018 (Nashville) on Limited Echocardiography. Dr. Wehber also had a book chapter published with Dr. Mahlow on Coronary Artery Aneurysms and Fistulas. Dr. Tonks had several publications including case reports on a Traumatic Ventricular Septal Defect, Congenitally Absent Left Circumflex Artery, and an Asymptomatic Occluded Left Main Coronary Artery. He also had a publication for his original research project on the Convergent Procedure with Dr. Mahlow.
